Going buggy?

1. Color a craft stick.
2. From construction paper, cut out a bug's head and two antennae. Glue the antennae to the head, then glue the head to one end of the stick.
3. Use a hole punch to make two white paper circles for eyes. Glue them on the head. For a nose, glue on a piece of chenille stick or crumpled tissue paper.
4. Cut out, decorate, and glue paper wings to the stick.
5. For the legs, glue three chenille-stick pieces onto the craft stick. Curl the ends of the legs to make feet.
6. To make a bug magnet, glue a magnetic strip to the back of the craft stick. To make a puppet, tie one end of a piece of yarn around the bug and the other end to a stick.
